### **MORE ALTERNATIVE MODES OF PAYMENT FOR TRAFFIC FINES**

The Singapore Police Force and Singapore Post Limited are pleased to announce that there are now two new modes of payment of traffic fines. As of 5 April 04, members of public can pay their fines online via Singapore Post's electronic bill payment portal vPOST ([www.vpost.com.sg](http://www.vpost.com.sg)). From 9 April 04, the public can also pay fines via SingPost's 150 Self-service Automated Machines (S.A.M.s) islandwide.

2 These two new alternative modes of payment are meant to increase convenience for members of the public when paying fines. Currently the public can pay their fines through various channels such as ATM machines, phone-banking, internet banking, cheques or coming personally to Traffic Police Headquarters.

3 Commander Traffic, Deputy Assistant Commissioner Teo Kian Teck said: "Letting users pay online and at S.A.M. will help boost the number of avenues available to the public to pay their traffic fines. This is in line with our aim in providing better service to members of public."
