**Singapore Post waives remittance charge to  
Tsunami-hit areas in Indonesia**

***Reduction of remittance charge to six Tsunami-hit countries via  
Western Union System***

**Singapore, 14 January 2005** – In support of the Tsunami disaster victims, Singapore Post (SingPost) today announced a commission waiver of the remittance service to the Tsunami-hit areas in Indonesia (Telegraphic or Electronic Transfer) from today till 31 January 2005.

The commission charge of S\$18 will be waived for remittance amounts not exceeding S\$1,000 to the Tsunami-hit areas in Indonesia. These include Meulaboh, Aceh Selatan, Tapaktuan, Simeulue, Sinabang, Pidie, Aceh Utara, Lhokseumawe, Bireuen Sigli, Aceh Blangpidie, Singkil.

Reduction of remittance charge via Western Union System

In addition, the remittance charge for our Urgent Money Transfer service via the *Western Union System*, a remittance service offered at all of our 40 post offices with the remittance licence, will be reduced to a flat rate of S\$12 to six Tsunami-hit countries. They include Indonesia, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Maldives and India (only to Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Andaman Nicobar Island and Pondicherry). The reduction rate applies to remittance amounts not exceeding S\$1,000. This will last till 10 February 2005.

SingPost customers can go to any of our 40 designated post offices located all over the island for their remittance transactions. A list of the 40 designated post offices can be found in Annex A.
